Director's Statement

My father used to smuggle cars in the 1990s. He committed other small-time crimes, too. According to him, it was a good time for the "risk takers", for someone like him with nothing to lose. During my childhood, there were times he had to "disappear" for a few weeks to hide from loan sharks, leaving my mother and me to deal with the consequences. However, I never doubted that he had a good heart. He was the most complicated yet the dearest criminal to me.

My mother also possessed a strange set of surviving skills. When I was 10, a group of gangsters knocked on our door and threatened to burn the house. I remember my fear turning into anger, but my mom remained calm, offered tea and had a long talk with them. I was amazed. Witnessing her unexpected approach indirectly planted the seed for this story. And by listening to the gangsters, I understood the complexity that had previously escaped me.

Now having finished my first feature, I understand myself better than before. I realize where the sympathy for "villains" comes from. In fact, we might all be born with "anti-hero" qualities. It just happens that the hero in my film exists in a No Man's Land, where morals and reasons are disputable.

Humans are limited, imperfect, and sometimes do unreasonable things. I am attracted to the hidden impulses that lie behind these actions, because they reflect the deeper self. And yet, we live in a world where everything is interconnected. Our wrongdoing has an effect on others and often we can't see the whole picture.

If my film has a point to make, I believe it is to raise this question: given our past, can we forgive ourselves? We must face the past if we are to live in the present. When memories have themselves become a form of punishment, how might we redeem ourselves?

EDDIE PENG biography

Eddie Peng is one of the most versatile and sought-after Chinese actors. His preparation and dedicated focus have been rewarded by both audience reception and numerous award nominations throughout Asia.

Peng had his breakthrough performance in *Jump!Ashin* in 2011, and was nominated for Best Actor at the Golden Horse Awards. He earned further nominations for Best Supporting Actor and Lead Actor roles in *Unbeatable* (2013), directed by Dante Lam, and *Rise of the Legend* (2014). *Our Time Will Come* (2017), directed by Ann Hui, earned Peng a Best Supporting Actor nomination at the Asian Film Awards. In 2018, Peng took the lead role in *Hidden Man*, directed by Jiang Wen, which was selected to represent China for the Best Foreign Language Film at the Academy Awards[®].

SYLVIA CHANG biography

Sylvia Chang started her acting career in the 70s in Taiwan and Hong Kong. In a career that has spanned over 40 years, she has acted in more than 100 films. She earned her first Golden Horse Award for Best Supporting Actress with *Prosperity and Perplexity* (dir. Lee Hsing), and followed this honor with a Golden Horse Award for Best Leading Actress with *My Grandfather* (dir. Ko Chun Hsiung). Numerous nominations and awards, and widespread critical and popular acclaim have followed.

Sylvia is also an influential scriptwriter and film director. Since 1981, she has directed 13 films that have been well received both in Hong Kong and Taiwan and internationally. Her films have been invited to major international film festivals, including the Berlin International Film Festival, London Film Festival, Toronto International Film Festival, and Busan International Film Festival.

Wang Yanhui, winner of the Wenhua Award, which is considered as the highest theatre honor in China, is the lead actor for Yunnan Modern Drama Troupe. In 2007, his excellent performance in *Trouble Makers* (dir. Cao Baoping) won a Chinese Film Media Award for Best Supporting Actor. Since his transition from theater into film, his acting has been widely recognized by the industry and audiences alike. Wang Yanhui delivers powerful performances by observing the nuance of the characters he portrays. His performance in *The Dead End* (dir. Cao Baoping) was particularly highly praised by Chinese critics.

JIANG PEIYAO biography

Jiang Peiyao, born in Beijing, is a fast-rising Chinese actress, who is pursuing her master degree in performing art at Beijing Film Academy. Jiang Peiyao has starred in several feature films, including *Line Walker 2: Invisible Spy* (dir. Jazz Boo), and *Sons of the Neon Night* (dir. Juno Mak), and the variety and power of her performances have been widely acclaimed by critics and audiences alike.
