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For her new feature, Kamila Andini delivers a superb portrait of a woman battling the trauma of war, fighting to free herself from the patriarchal social dictates of her era.

SYNOPSIS

Set amid the political violence of late-1960s Indonesia, Kamila Andini's intoxicating film BEFORE, NOW & THEN follows Nana, the beautiful wife of a wealthy plantation owner whose inner life remains with her deceased first husband, murdered in the civil war a decade prior. A survivor, Nana values her safety and material comforts, but carries out a haunted existence, dreaming of her lost love. Forced to confront her husband's blatant infidelity, Nana makes an unusual connection with his younger mistress, Ino. The two women, sharing their secrets and desires, discover a newfound freedom and intimacy withheld from them both by the strictures of patriarchal society. Framed by elegant cinematography and a lush score, BEFORE, NOW & THEN is a lyrical, transporting character study in the lineage of Wong Kar-wai and Apichatpong Weerasethakul, "wreathed in poetic melancholy and never less than beautiful" (Deadline).



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Women are the real victims of our times. But in every era, there is always the figure of a woman who has never once made herself a victim, even if she cannot be separated from making sacrifices. *BEFORE, NOW & THEN* is the story of a woman who is the victim of an era – war, politics, rebellion and the patriarchal society – and who wants to find the meaning of her own freedom, as a woman. She forms a friendship with one of her husband's mistresses, because that is the only way she can get support.

Independence for Indonesia did not guarantee freedom for its people; pressure comes in ever-changing forms. With this film I want to show the many forms of pressure that continue to oppress women today. The image will work with sound to express Nana's emotions and anxiety. *BEFORE*, *NOW & THEN* talks about a woman's secrets – about how she keeps her problems hidden. It locates political circumstances, domestic problems, anxieties and personal happiness within small, everyday events. Hair becomes a binding metaphor for women throughout the story. This is a simple period film, employing a gentle touch and subtle compositions.

The camera will move slowly or remain still, like a painting. As on stage, the performances of the actors will reveal multiple layers of their characters. The production design will be vital, bringing the outside world into the house, seeking freedom in the smallest spaces, and revealing the history of small objects, especially through women's hair and bodies. A woman must excel at keeping secrets, both hers and those of her family. If there is a problem, let it remain hidden behind her hair.

WRITER/DIRECTOR BIOGRAPHY

Kamila Andini is a mother and filmmaker based in Jakarta, Indonesia. Concerns with social culture, gender equality and environmental issues led to her passion to make films with a distinctive narrative perspective.

Her debut feature film *The Mirror Never Lies* (2011) recounts the life of sea nomad on the Pacific Ocean off Indonesia. Her second, *The Seen and Unseen* (2017) portrays a dualistic cinematic universe based on the Balinese philosophical concept of Sekala/Niskala. Both films have screened in over 50 film festivals around the world and received some 30 national and international awards, including the Grand Prix for Best Feature Film, Berlinale Generation Kplus in 2018.

She has also directed a number of short films. After *Following Diana* (2015), *Memoria* (2016), and Sekar (2019), her short *Back Home* (2019) formed part of the omnibus production *Angel Sign* (2019). Recently, she has expanded her directing work into theatre; her debut, based on her second feature '*The Seen and Unseen*', was staged at the Esplanade Singapore 2018 and Asia Topa Melbourne in 2019. Her most recent theatrical production is the stage and virtual performance monologue, *Nusa Yang Hilang* (2021).

Her third feature, Yuni, (2021) won the Platform Prize at the Toronto International Film Festival. Before, Now & Then is her fourth feature film

Gita Fara has produced three fictions and a documentary feature that have played widely on the international festival circuit. Ifa Isfansyah graduated from the Television Department of the Indonesian Institute of Art in Jogjakarta. He began his career in cinema as producer and director of several short films, including *Be Quiet, Exam Is In Progress!* (Tokyo ShortShort, Competition, 2006) and *Half Teaspoon* (Grand Prize Hong Kong Independent Film Video Award & competition, IFFR 2008). He was selected by the Asian Film Academy Busan in 2006 and received a scholarship to attend the Im Kwon Taek College of Film & Performing Arts in Korea.
