

Ma (Wu Renlin) is a humble farmer with little to offer his timid and sickly wife, Cao (Hai Qing), except for a small abandoned house on a barren patch of land. From just a few seeds, their newly planted crops take root and flourish; and similarly, an unexpected bond between the two starts to blossom. As seasons pass their dedication to each other grows stronger, but change and adversity soon threaten the idyllic existence they share.

Li Ruijun is a Chinese film director and screenwriter. He was born in 1983 in, Gansu China, and graduated from the Communication University of Shanxi. He has directed 5 feature films, all of which tend to focus on the relationship between human beings and the land, as well as the rural attitude towards family, life, and death in a rapidly changing China. His films are predominantly set in his hometown of Gaotai with his close friends and relatives acting in his films.

WU Renlin (as MA Youtie)

WU Renlin is a Chinese film actor, who has appeared in many of director LI Ruijun's previous films, including The Old Donkey (2010) and Fly With The Crane (2012).

HAI Qing (as CAO Guiying)

HAI Qing is one of China's most acclaimed and beloved actresses, who has worked in both film and television. She has appeared in titles such as ZHANG Dalei's Stars Await Us (2020), Dante LAM's Operation Red Sea (2018), XUE Xiaolu's Finding Mr. Right (2013), and CHEN Kaige's Sacrifice (2010).

HAI began acting at the age of seven appearing in television shows before joining the Jiangsu Provincial Theatre School at the age of twelve. In 1997 she was accepted into the Beijing Film Academy. Hai returned to the small screen a few years later, appearing in several supporting roles before starring in what was to become her bestknown role in the show A Beautiful Daughter-in-law Era (2009) which went on to receive three award nominations; two at the Golden Eagle Awards and one at the Feitian Television Awards. Her performance in Dwelling Narrowness (2009), and A Little Reunion (2019) established her as one of the most recognizable actresses in China.

In 2015 Hai became the first UN Women National Ambassador for China.
